  - Professional development & community building
  - High Quality
- Department commitments
  - Shared funding for 5 years
  - 5 year degree completion (or less)
  - Mentoring, progress tracking
  - Faculty & students participate in professional development
- Student commitments
  - Annual goals & progress reports
  - Professional development, community building, grant applications

### Graduate Scholars Award

#### 1. Changes:

- Participate in community building / Professional Development
- Support History and or Plan
- Renewal: progress, training, potential
- Mentoring plan

- Academic achievements and training
- Letters examples and potential contribution
- Support Plan



### **Doctoral Fellowship Award**

1. >3<sup>rd</sup> year, submit 2 (ranked)/program

#### 2. Changes:

- Faculty letter: must describe performance & potential
- Support History & Plan
- Goals
- Mentoring plan

- Multiple papers, presentations, awards, leadership
- Letters examples and potential contribution
- Support Plan



### Dissertation Fellowship Award

1. Candidacy, submit 2 (ranked)/program

#### 2. Changes:

- Faculty letter: must describe performance & potential
- Support History & Plan
- Work plan and Mentoring plan towards completion
- Student essay on completion plan and impact

- Multiple papers, presentations, awards, leadership
- Letters examples and potential contribution
- Articulate **impact** examples



### Unidel Distinguished Graduate Scholars Award

#### 1. Admitted to program

#### 2. Changes:

- Grad College funds 3 years (any combination)
- Program must provide partial support for 2 other years (or less if degree completed)
  - 9-month min stipends
  - Grad College will top-up to \$34,000 + 3 summer mo.
- Submit grant or fellowship proposal, development of an IDP

- Very high GPA (3.9), GRE (90%), Institutional ranking etc.
- Multiple papers, presentations, awards, leadership
- Letters examples and potential contribution



### Award Success Summary

- Evidence of accomplishments (examples)
  - GPA, # of awards, publications/presentations, training
  - Other: Leadership, service, achievements (non-profit, triathlete)

• **Letters** from advisors

Impact in the field

### Holistic Admissions – What it means

- Assessment based on wide range of criteria, including
  - Academic performance (many measures)
  - Writing samples
  - Application essays
  - Video or phone interviews
  - Research experience
  - Non-cognitive traits
  - Co-curricular activities
  - Leadership experience
- Look at multiple indicators to identify students who should be included for further review



### Non-Holistic Admissions

- Rejecting applicants based on a single measure
  - GRE threshold
  - GPA threshold
  - Writing sample
  - Lack of research experience



### Holistic Admissions – why you might do it

- Admit the students who are most likely to succeed
  - GPA or GRE may not be the best indicators
- Number of applications is decreasing
  - May need new approaches to bring in the number of students you want
- Increase diversity
  - Programs that use holistic approach find that they become more diverse

Widely used for undergrad, med school admissions (You may already be doing it)



### Holistic Admissions vs. Quantitative Criteria

- Quantitative criteria can be
  - Applied consistently
  - Not subject to evaluator bias
  - Seems more fair than qualitative evaluations (essay, interview) alone

Quantitative > Qualitative only

...but quantitative measures also have systematic biases



### Holistic Admissions vs. Quantitative Criteria

- Holistic approach includes quantitative criteria but adds more
  - Maybe Quantitative GRE score is a good measure for your program
    - A strict cut-off value may still not be a good idea
  - Should you also assess communications skills?
    - What measure would you use?

Qualitative + Quantitative > Quantitative Only



### Holistic Admissions – How to Implement

- What do successful students look like in your program?
- Are admissions decisions working well now? What should change?
- Can you find new measures to would give you a better idea of whether an applicant will succeed?
  - Video interview with structured questions
  - Prompts on essays to assess non-cognitive skills
- Develop a rubric or scorecard to have consistent measures



### Holistic Admissions – Options

- If you are interested, we can work with you
  - This will be a learning experience
  - Every program is different

- Note that UD does not require GREs
  - Programs can decide for themselves if they want to make them optional

### Other Awards

- 1. Graduate Student Travel Award (formerly "Professional Development")
  - Changes effective for awards approved after 12/31/2019
  - \$ 1500 total award over grad. course of study
  - 1-for-1 matching from other source
  - Travel, lodging, food, registration, printing, etc.
  - Professional Dev., data collection, etc.
- 2. Bridge Funding (details not final)
  - Backstop to help departments commit to 5-year funding plans
  - Limited term student stipend support
  - Extenuating circumstances that interrupt funding stream
  - Merit based
  - Program/college must share cost, provide tuition



### Undergraduate Summer Research Program

- Grad College will fund about 35 potential future grad applicants
  - Non-UD undergrads
  - Any discipline
  - 10 weeks, fully funded
  - Advertised at recent recruiting conferences
  - Postcard ads available
- https://grad.udel.edu/summer-research/
  - Includes a total of 12 programs that host students from other universities
